Reducing food waste in Scotland: How much do we know? Reducing food waste in Scotland: How much do we know? Edinburgh is considered to be the best food city in the UK, according to a recent survey by Which? magazine. So, what are we doing to make sure our food is handled, stored and disposed of in the most sustainable way? A new report from the Centre for Environment, Fisheries and Aquaculture Science (Cefas) on the food supply chain in Scotland, looks at what we know and what we do not know about food waste in Scotland, the most important thing is to know the extent of the problem and why it happens. Cefas worked with partners to collate a snapshot of existing knowledge on food waste in Scotland, based on scientific research, European recommendations and statistics from the latest Scottish Food and Drink (SFD) waste data. Why do we still waste so much food? The food supply chain is a complex, multifaceted and evolving system. There are many factors to consider, but a lack of detailed information and awareness as to how food is produced, sold and disposed of, combined with a lack of enforcement, continues to lead to high levels of food waste. This leads to excess costs and food being thrown away. “In Scotland, the system is complex, with many different agencies involved in managing the waste and recycling of food and other food-related material. As such, it is hard to determine where to start with tackling food waste,” explains Toni Hinchliffe, Director of Waste Reduction and Waste Prevention at Cefas. “There is a lot of waste in the food supply chain, but we do not know the scale of the problem, and also what is actually occurring when it is wasted.” The SFD data provides an insight into what Scotland’s food waste is. For example, households disposed of 6,392,099 kg of food and drinks in 2016 – this equates to 1,320 kg per person. We produced 9,769,053 kg of food waste in the same year, this is 270kg per person. What else can be done? The Scottish Government’s Food Waste Strategy is currently being developed with consultation work well underway. The

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
